Open air burning shall be confined to an open burning device or to a		
pit no larger than 3 feet by 3 feet in size.		
"Open burning device" shall mean any device for the purpose of		
containing a recreational fire.		
Burning materials shall be commercially produced charcoal,		
briquettes, or clean, dry, seasoned firewood, not including brush,		
pressure treated wood or creosote treated wood.		
Materials being burned shall be confined to the fire pit at all times.		
Open air burning shall be confined to a location that provides a		
minimum distance of 3 metres in all directions, including vertically,		
from		
Adjacent properties.		
Combustible structures or objects.		
An effective extinguishing agent of sufficient volume with the		
capability of extinguishing the fire shall be immediately available for		
use.		
Open air burnings shall be attended, controlled and supervised at all		
times.		
Open air burnings shall consider environmental conditions and are		
not permitted when:		
1. Wind speed is in excess of 30 km/h.???		
There is rain or foggy weather forecasted.		
3. Air quality or smog warnings have been issued by the Ministry		
of Environment and Climate Change for Ontario,		
Any non-compliant burning requires a request to extinguish.		
Fees for Services will be charged as per the Village Fee By-Law if		
there is a failure to comply with any requirements of the By-Law to		
Regulate Open Air Burning.		

If the answer to any of these questions is "NO" the property owner or tenant may be subject to a charge under the Fee for Service By-Law.
