CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

During the stop, police seized a quantity of fentanyl, methamphetamine, carfentanyl, and other offence-related property. The drugs have an estimated street value of over \$27,000.

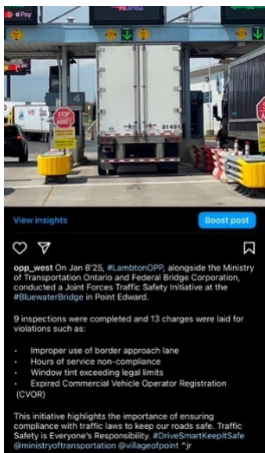
As a result, three individuals, all from Wallaceburg, were arrested and charged under the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act (CDSA) with:

- Possession of a Schedule I substance for the purpose of trafficking - Fentanyl

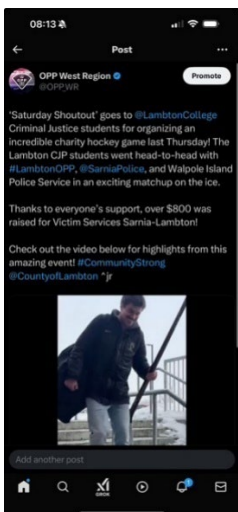

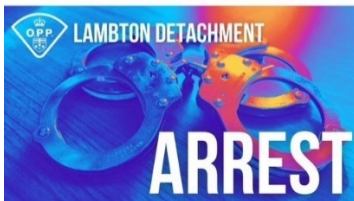

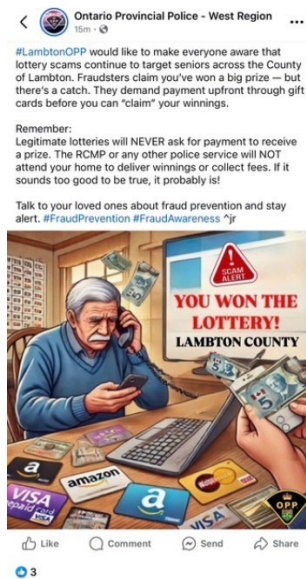

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW

January and February 2025

The School Resource Officers (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during January and February. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

SRO in-class sessions for both secondary schools highlighted youth and the law, peer to peer relationships, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Careers in policing presentations were also presented to post-secondary aged students.

SRO's attended many of the county primary grade schools as well during in January and February to address youth bullying issues and social media awareness.

January

Point Edward

12 years old female student getting aggressive with staff at Bridgeview Public School. Had a fit and broke some property. Police attended. Student calm upon Police arrival. Student picked up by family member. School will deal with student.

Corunna

Report of 10-year-old child calling the Helpline advising they wanted to harm themselves with Tylenol. Subscriber information from number had residence in Corunna. Officers attended and were informed there was no 10-year-old at the residence. Phone number came back to informant's daughter. No threat of suicide and all denied phoning. Mother assured officers of no Tylenol present, and children educated on importance of not making false phone calls.

St Clair Township

Complainant reporting her daughter is missing. Believed to be with her friend, who she is not supposed to be hanging out with. Female located with her friend. No safety concerns. Complainant attended to pick up her daughter.

Watford

Caller advising Police she had received a threatening message via snapchat. She advised Police that the subject in question told her that she would jump her and that she should go kill herself. Youth warned by Police.

Petrolia

Youth Perspective Services advising ongoing issues with a youth male. Youth not returning before his 21:00 hrs. curfew. The curfew is a house rule.

Petrolia

Missing youth. Foster parent saying her foster child wrote a letter that he was leaving. Letter outlined that he had a plan and was safe. Police spoke to multiple family members and friends. Cell phone pinged. Girlfriend's mother relayed information that the youth was at the Wyoming train station. Male was located safe at the train station. Transported to grandmother's house.

Lambton Shores

Male youth received text from an unknown number stating that he needed to pay \$200.00 or else they would send a photo to his contacts. One photo was of the victim standing and giving the middle finger. The second photo was of a male standing with his penis out on a sink. The photo was obviously fake, and not of the victim.

Petrolia

Female arrived late to school. She had taken the school bus but attended Petrolia E.R. before going to school. Female student had been cutting herself and needed stitches. V.P. called EMS since Female had made suicidal comments. Went voluntarily with EMS.

Corunna

Youth acting out against her family members in a heated argument and threatening to kill herself by jumping in front of a train. Police attended and spoke with youth who had calmed down and indicated she did not have any intention of hurting herself and had made the comments out of anger. No grounds for MHA apprehension. MHA services and advice given. Youth to go to stepmother's residence for a visit to change her focus.

Petrolia

Vehicle in the ditch on Gypsy Flats Road. Three occupants in the vehicle stating they don't have phones and would like police called. Driver lost control due to poor road conditions and entered the ditch. The driver stated he has never possessed a driver's license, and the vehicle belongs to his grandfather. Vehicle was removed by Scott's Towing. Two PON's issued.

Corunna

Sobriety check 15-year-old driver without a license. Driver admitted to consumption. Warn range of 3 days suspended. Cannabis and alcohol in the vehicle. Driver charged.

Forest

Complainant received 3rd party information that her son was yelling and saying he was going to kill himself. Police spoke to male who advised he was not suicidal and had no plans in place to harm himself. EMS attended and cleared male. MRCT provided male with support options. No grounds for apprehension.

Corunna

Mother calling concerned for her 16-year-old daughter who is upset and made a comment saying she does not want to live anymore, has nothing to live for & has suicidal ideations. OPP officers and MCRT were on scene and promptly located youth in the park near her house. After she was spoken to, it was determined there were no grounds for apprehension. Youth advised on choice of words and follow-up to be done with mom and daughter.

Forest

Report from the VP at NLSS. Police spoke with the VP who advised a student had brought a THC vape pen to school and another student had admitted to using THC during the day. The VP stated that the student in possession of the THC vape pen had been suspended for 3 days. Education provided to the student by Police.

Petrolia

Caller decided to meet and sell an Apple Vision Pro at the Petrolia Arena. The caller stated two male parties stole the product then fled on foot before jumping into a vehicle. Police located, then stopped the vehicle with 3 occupants inside. Two youth males arrested for theft over \$5,000 and one female issued a Part III for no insurance.

Corunna

Mother and 17-year-old son both called police regarding ongoing dispute. Police attended and spoke to both parties. Son agreed to respect rules of the house, mother advised if he doesn't, she will take steps to have him removed. Son will attempt to go to friend's house for the day to allow all to cool off.

Lambton Shores

Report of a vehicle in the ditch on Port Franks Estates Road. Lambton OPP attended and located youth driver. Signs of impairment and admitted consumption. ASD demand and failed. Youth arrested and charged.

February

Corunna

10-year-old student ran away from school. Student did not have permission to leave. Student located by school staff and Police. Brought back to school. Student and guardian spoken to. WRA meeting to follow. Multiple community resources involved with the student and her two siblings.

Same 10-year-old student ran away from school. Did not have any permission to leave. Student located by school staff and Police. Brought back to school. Student and guardian spoken to.

Forest

9-year-old youth attempting to stab parents with a pen. Female struggling mentally seeking support from an officer. MCRT involved and ongoing communication with family.

Corunna

Ongoing issues with a 11-year-old female student at Sir John Moore in Corunna. Student has been acting out and been targeting another student with verbal comments. Police spoke with student. Student warned. School considering different measures.

Point Edward

Principal at the School in Point Edward reporting a 11-year-old student made a comment in French class that he would shoot up the school on Friday. This was said in relation to the announcement of a French quiz on the Friday. Student received a 2-day suspension from school. Safe School Principal notified. Police spoke with student and mother.

Lambton Shores

Report regarding a 12-year-old female distributing naked photos of herself. Police spoke to the original complainant, determined it was a photo of her chest with a piece of cloth covering her nipples.

Warwick

13-year-old female calls police to say she has a plan to kill her dad but can't go through with it. Plot thickens to include her girlfriends' grandparents followed by a suicide pact with girlfriend and plan on how to proceed. Females apprehended. Both girls formed at Bluewater Health Sarnia. All potential victims notified, showed no concern with threat, only concerns for mental health.

Point Edward

Police received a call from the Principal at Bridgeview Public School. Principal advised that a teacher had relayed information regarding a Grade 8 student who had spoken to a grade 10 student from Wallaceburg on the phone. The grade 8 student had told him that he was going to attend the Wallaceburg student's residence and shoot him with a gun. Police spoke with the Victim and mother who advised would like SOC spoken to warned and educated on threats.

Brigden

13-year-old female in contact with unknown party on Tik Toc. No safety concerns at this point. Female spoken to by her parents as well as Police about the risks with online chatting. Youth blocked the party, who had already blocked her. Parents were advised to remove Tik Toc from daughter's phone.

Forest

Vice Principal at NLSS advised that cannabis found in an unattended backpack and was requesting Police to send cannabis for disposal. Cannabis surrendered and lodged. To be disposed of.

Forest

NLSS Guidance counsellor advising that a student was in crisis and unable to calm down. Police located the student within the school building, lying on the ground and screaming. Police spoke with the student who de-escalated the situation. MCRT attended and spoke with the student. No grounds for apprehensions and safety planning discussed. MCRT followed up with the student.

Petrolia

2 students of LCCVI were observed throwing out fruit from the school bus. Police spoke with students about bus safety and consequences of their actions.

Plympton- Wyoming

14 -year-old male located driving. Male verbally provided false ID, lying about his age. Male was cautioned for obstruct and his father was spoken to on the phone. Driver charged.

Forest

Report from NLSS V.P. regarding two students being caught using cannabis at school. VP advised that students have been suspended. V.P requesting incident to be documented for Police information. Information regarding Rebounds C.A.R.E. program provided to school.

Petrolia

Police received a call from LCCVI Principal advising students had purchased and used cannabis at school. Police attended. School conducting investigation and will follow up with Police regarding details. Educational conversations with youth provided.

Enniskillen

Female youth calling Police that she attempted to kill herself 2 nights ago by overdose. Youth concerned there might be something left in her system. Feeling suicidal again. Police attended and female apprehended and brought to Bluewater Hospital. Formed by doctor.

Petrolia

Report of mother locating a small amount of marijuana and rolling papers in her 15-year-old son's bedroom. Son upset that his mother went through his things without his knowledge, and he began yelling and swearing and slamming door inside the house scaring his mother. Police were called and spoke with mother and son and both to stay separated for the night.

Fight between two male students at LCCVI. Video footage reviewed. Students suspended by school. One of the students diverted to Rebound

For the month of January and February, there were 8 occurrences relating to mental health/suicidal ideations, all involving youth ages **13-17 years**. (January – 3 occurrences, February – 5 occurrences)

There were 08 motor vehicle collision occurrences during the months of January and February involving youth ages **16-17 years of age**. (January – 08 occurrences, February - 05 occurrences)

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in 9 youth being warned (January – 04 occurrences, February – 5 occurrences) and 19 Provincial Offence Notices given under the Highway Traffic Act. (January – 11 occurrences, February – 08 occurrences) Youth ranged from **16-18 years of age**.

CRIME & TRAFFIC – JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2025

AREA CRIME SERGEANT:

- Crime members and OPP Criminal Investigation Branch are investigating a conspiracy to commit murder.
- Crime members and OPP Criminal Investigation Branch are investigating the suspicious death of an infant.
- Crime members and OPP Criminal Investigation Branch are still investigating Andrew Chute homicide at the Marthaville Conservation area.
- Crime members are investigating missing person Deanna Timms. \$50000 reward being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of whoever is responsible.
- 3 Criminal Harassment investigations.
- 4 major frauds being investigated and 1 major cyber fraud.
- 11 Sudden Deaths were investigated.
- Arkona Bank robbery investigation continues, arrested have been made and disclosure is being prepared
- Multijurisdictional auto theft case involving a Lambton County resident victim continues. Police have seized a substantial number of vehicles, but numerous vehicles remain uncovered. 4 arrests have been made, and a Preliminary Hearing has been requested by the accused parties.
- The Fraud Unit attended area banks and provided a contact number to be called if the bank suspects any fraudulent transactions. The bank called the Fraud Unit 3 times which resulted in the prevention of 3 elderly victims being scammed out of a total of \$40000.

CSCU SERGEANT:

- During the months of January and February 2025 Lambton CSCU investigated 7 occurrences.
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 9 charges.
- Lambton CSCU wrote 5 warrants for drug trafficking and property crimes investigations. The unit completed 3 warrant service entries.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation. Persons arrested: 3; Persons charged: 3; Charges: 6. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (Fentanyl and Methamphetamine). Lambton CSCU conducted significant physical surveillance and conducted a stop of a vehicle. Search revealed a large quantity of Fentanyl (280 grams) and Methamphetamine (24 grams). Total seizure value \$31,400.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation. Persons arrested: 2; Persons charged: 1; Charges: 3. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking (Methamphetamine and Hydromorphone). Lambton CSCU executed a S.11 CDSA warrant on a residence in Wallaceburg with strong connections to Walpole Island First Nation. Methamphetamine and Hydromorphone located and large amount of cash. Other drug trafficking indicia also located. Total value of seizure: \$27,971.
- Lambton CSCU continues to assist Walpole Island Police Service with enforcement to combat the opioid crisis in that community.
- Lambton CSCU had 1 member assigned to front-line patrol in a supervisor capacity.
- Lambton CSCU had 1 member assigned to the ROPE squad on a temporary assignment.
- Lambton CSCU had 1 member on medical leave for 1 month.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Essex CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Elgin-Middlesex CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis.

TRAFFIC:

- During this reporting period OPP members conducted sixty-seven (67) traffic enforcement initiatives
- Seven (7) PON's were issued and Twenty-three (23) written warnings
- There were 4 motor vehicle collisions
- Two (2) RIDE Programs were conducted
- One (1) Impaired Driver was arrested

FRONTLINE SUPPORT UNIT (FSU):

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for the OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to the OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Through the use of technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
