CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS

Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

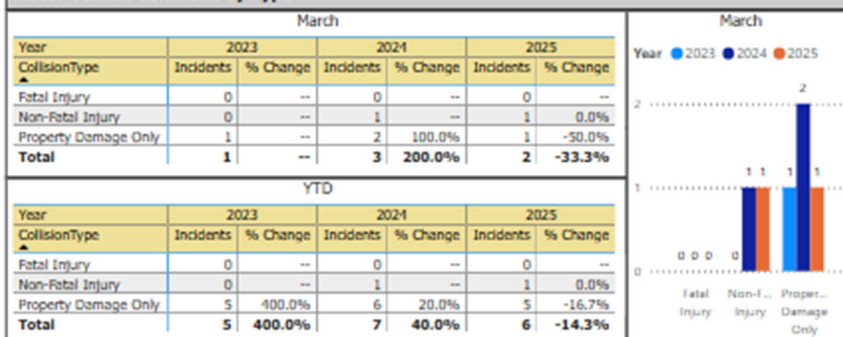
Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

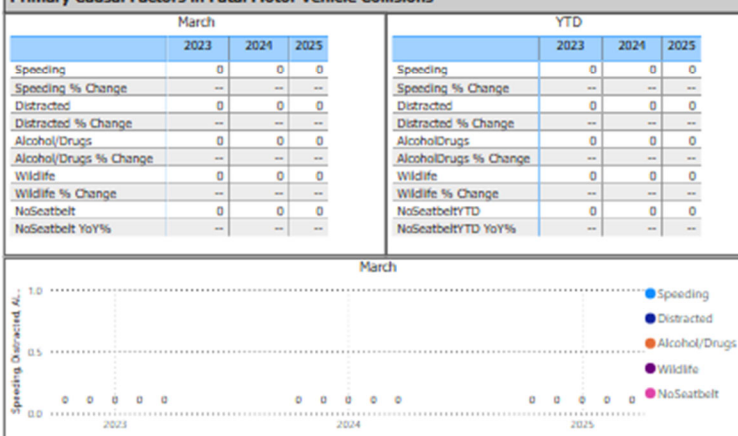

Primary Causal Factors in Fatal Motor Vehicle Collisions



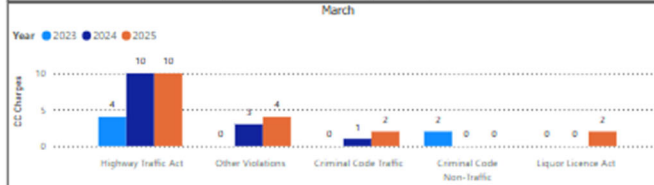

Youth Charges by Disposition Type

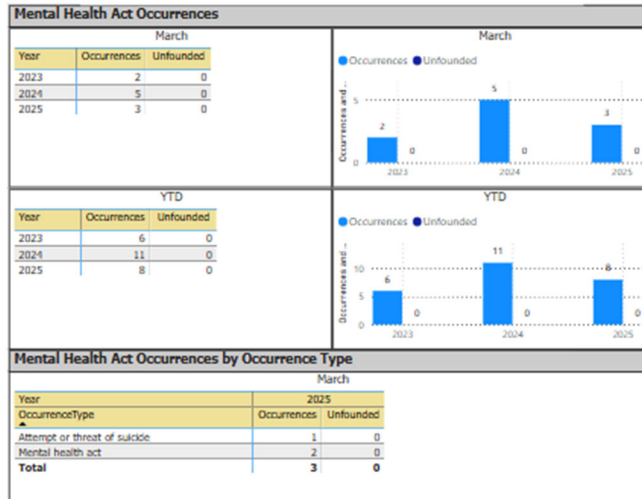


Youth Charges by Disposition and Occurrence Type

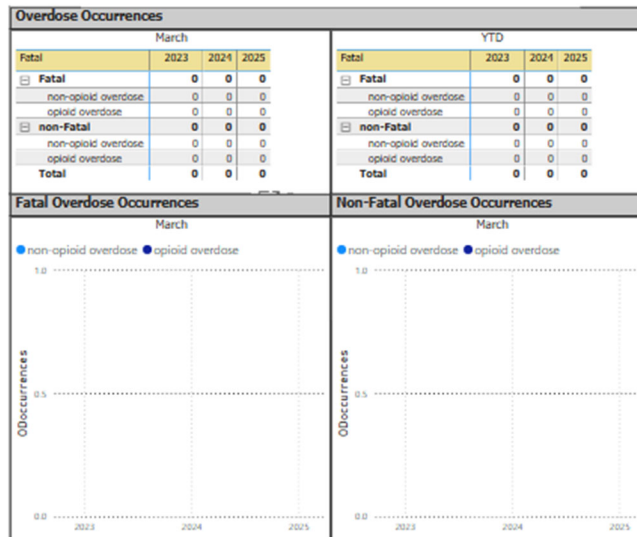

- Lambton CEO has been actively building and improving relationships with local, regional, and international news outlets through email correspondence and phone interviews.
- Media release was posted regarding traffic safety messaging, ie: impaired driving.
- The CEO showcased the enforcement efforts of Lambton OPP members in cases of traffic stops and impaired driving offences in March & April.
- CEO attended multiple Recruit Ambassador check-in meetings as well as WR OPP CEO check-in meetings
- Continued to work on/posted an IPV resources video with Lambton OPP's Abuse Issues Investigator

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW

The School Resource Officers (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of each county secondary schools during March and April. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during lunch periods as well as the end of the school day when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including youth and the law, peer to peer relationships, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Careers in policing presentations were also presented to post-secondary aged students.

The SRO assisted many of the counties primary grade schools as well during this period regarding youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions.

MARCH

St. Clair Township- Son standing on the fence in the backyard saying he wants to kill himself has threatened suicide in the past. Child diagnosed ADHB and ODD. Acted up due to not getting his Nintendo. Son came down from fence and play put in place with help of MCRT.

St. Clair Township- Dispatched to indecent acts. Parents advised daughter who is 10 years old was sending sexual photos over snapchat to unknown adult male and he was sending them back. Crime Unit and Sgt engaged, electronic devices seized, and investigation taken over by Crime unit.

Petrolia- 14 years old male is 'shooting' random people with a pellet gun from a window across from Crabby Joes. Police responded and confirmed there were no injuries. Male located and arrested. Male charged for multiple offences.

St. Clair Township- Student has left the school property. The student has left school several times. Police attend and locate the student walking with the Vice Principal. Police follow the student back to school, guardian advised. The student refused to take the bus home but was then picked up shortly after. Multiple resources involved with the student already.

St. Clair Township- Victim was at skate park, 16–18-year-old male approached him said he wanted to touch him and "humped" the victim's leg, victim ran home and told parents. Minimal suspect information available, statement taken from victim, no witnesses available, no cameras in area.

St. Clair Township- When Police attended Sir John Moore School in Corunna for an issue with one of the students, the principal informed officer that an 11-year-old student had left the property. Student observed in a new residential area under construction. Small pond in the area. When Police observe student is he very close to the water. Police exited the

cruiser and secured the student. Mother arrived shortly after and brought the student home. Multiple resources are already involved with the student.

St. Clair Township- Complainant reporting 12 years old acting out (4 calls regards this female in March), requesting police advice. Police attended, daughter engaged with St Clair Child and Youth, Psychologist, school counsellor. Advice provided to reinforce rules of house, information regarding CCs43 to protect all members of house.

Lambton Shores- Caller reported online harassment and threats to her son via social media. Police attended the caller's address and spoke with the victim. Further investigation revealed that a male youth was pretending to be the victim girlfriend. Youth charged and diverted.

Petrolia- A youth approached Lambton Cadets at the grocery store, pulled a knife, and pressed it against their chests. No injuries, the knife blade was not utilized. youth id'd and later located and arrested for assault with a weapon x2. See report.

Plympton- Wyoming- An incident happened on the school bus between two 13 years old student. Physical altercation. Both parties were spoken to by the school. Police spoke with them and cautioned them for their actions.

St. Clair Township- 13 years old female texting suicidal comments to complainant Police attend residence of female. She admitted to ingesting 9 pills that were prescribed to her - EMS attended and transported female to Bluewater health with mother.

St. Clair Township- 14 years old student was sent to the principal's office for being disorderly by throwing things around the class and being disruptive. The student had just returned to school after a 7-day suspension. Staff were speaking to student, but he was swinging on a chair & looking at his phone. Police intervened (already there for another matter) due to respect issue and the student challenged officer. Student was cautioned. Mother arrived and brought him home. Student is not welcome back at school.

Complainant reporting assault against her 12 years old son on school bus. Complainant advised to contact the school. Follow up with principal completed. Investigation yields no assault.

Petrolia- Student disclosed some weird post on a Tic Toc group named LCCVI Huzz. School has not set up this group. 1 student is currently not attending school because he feels picked on. Parties identified and spoken to about social media use and respect.

Lambton Shores- Police received a call from the VP of NLSS. The VP advised that NLSS students had attended his office and stated a car of youth from Chatham are coming to NLSS to fight. Police located the car of youth from Chatham. On going Snapchat group chat with hateful/mean comments between group from CK and NLSS. NLSS address provided to CK students who attended. No fight occurred. CK students trespassed from NLSS property. NLSS Students trespassed from McGregor HS in Chatham. Education provided to all involved.

Petrolia- Assault incident at LCCVI in Petrolia. Ongoing dispute between two former friends. Victim had enough. After name calling and some shoving over the months did, he punched back. Victim was pushed from behind by accused on today's date. Victim wanted charges laid. Accused diverted to rebound.

Lambton Shores- Assault at lunch break at the NLSS property. Youth jumped at the football field. Multiple statements taken by school staff. No camera in that area. 3 students suspended by school. 2 youths diverted to Rebound.

Dawn- Euphemia - Disturbance call from Florence. 6 youths intimidating owner of Old Mill restaurant, with baseball bats. No threats, no items stolen. Youths located nearby, stated they were just walking by when they were stared down by owner and complainant, when asked what they were staring at, some screaming ensued. Owner confirmed the same and just asked for youths to be trespassed from store.

Lambton Shores- 16 years old Female attempted suicide. She wished to kill herself. Female tied an extension cord to the outside door handle to her bedroom door put the cord over the door and put the cord around her neck. Female stated when she was just about to pass out, she stopped. Police arrived just as she had stopped.

Female apprehended under the mental health act due to her attempt to kill herself. Female was admitted at Bluewater health Sarnia on a Form 1.

For the month of March, there were **6** occurrences relating to mental health/suicidal ideations, all involving youths ages **13-17 years**.

There were **5** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the months of March involving youths **16-17 years of age**.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **9** youths being warned and **19** Provincial Offence Notices given under the Highway Traffic Act. Youths ranged from 16-17 years of age.

APRIL

Watford-Report of bullying. The complainant advised of bullying for classmates. All parties spoken to with their parents. Education on bullying provided. All parties believe they were being bullied by each other. All advised that they avoid each other in the future.

St. Clair Township -Police were dispatched to group of youth in a physical altercation. Police attended spoke with all youth and parents. Advice and youth cautioned on behaviours for assault and mental health resources.

Enniskillen- Police dispatched to well being check for student who has not been to school in four days. Police attended and no concerns with student or parents.

St. Clair Township -Police received a call from the principal regarding a 10-yr old student who has had escalating behaviours and made a threat to a student on the bus. Police to meet with student and parents and provided education and resources. Police attended school and provided presentation to entire class on bullying.

Brooke Alvinston- Police were dispatched to mischief complaint at the Alvinston Arena Playground. Police spoke with youth regarding damaging of the slide. The complainant did not want to pursue criminal charges. Police and parents accepting of Police's advice.

St. Clair Township- Police received a call for the school that a student had left school with out permission. The student was located and returned to school. Police spoke with the student and parents regarding consequences of running away from school. Safety planning discussed with student and school.

Lambton Shores- Police received a call that a 10-year-old student was angry at school. Had just been involved in a fight and returning to class from the principal office, while walking back the student made an utterance that he was going to blow up the school. Police spoke with the student, parents and principal.

St. Clair Township-Off duty officer reporting 10 yr old child wandering in street and was the 2nd call regarding child. Child autistic/non-verbal. CAS was contacted for follow up. Police confirmed safe place by police. Both parents notified.

St. Clair Township-Police received a complaint from a youth that her friend was "missing". Police contacted parent and youth. Youth not missing and safe with Parent.

St. Clair Township-Police received a call from the principal requesting a well being check on a student that has not been at school. Police located student and parent, and student had been sick for multiple days. The parent advised that they would call the school in the future with any absences.

St. Clair Township/Sarnia- Police received a call from the crisis line advising a 13-yr old youth was suicidal with no location provided. OPP and Sarnia police tasked. 13 yr old located and spoke with MCRT. No grounds for apprehension and resources were provided.

Plympton-Wyoming-Complainant confronted youth in a park who he suspected to be ringing his doorbell at night and then running away. Male warned for confronting youth in the way that he did, and youth and his parents spoken to. All parties cautioned. Youth directed to stay off males' property and complainant directed to not confront anymore youth and engage them at the park.

Lambton Shores- Police received a call for a reported assault at school. Police attended spoke with all parties involved. Incident deemed as a consensual fight between both youths. All parties and parents spoken, warned and education on consequences of actions. Police scheduled presentation with all senior classes to discuss bullying and the law.

St. Clair Township- Police received a walk in complaint that her grand daughter was being bullied at school. All parties spoken to, resources and education provided for further interactions.

St. Clair Township- Complainant called after her 13-yr old daughter had an altercation with a sibling and then went to a friend's house and refused to come home. Police called complainant who advised that her daughter had returned home, and all was in order.

Lambton Shores- 911 hang-up. On going issues with family member, displaying signs of paranoia and schizophrenia. Youth called because sibling was yelling at his grandmother. Police attended, no grounds for apprehension, nothing criminal. MCRT followed up.

Petrolia-Caller advised his friend broke up with his gf today now she's messaging him saying she is going to kill herself. Police attended and spoke with the youth's parent who advised that they were on route to the hospital for a mental health assessment.

St. Clair Township-Police received a report that the complainants 14 yr old son just snuck out of the house. Youth returned a short time later.

Lambton Shores-Police received a call for a report assault at the high school. Police spoke with all parties and observed video footage of the event. Accused arrested and charged. Safety planning and victim services in place.

Petrolia-Motor vehicle collision. Report of vehicle vs 14 yr old. 14 yr old sustained no injuries and declined EMS.

Petrolia-Police received a call that a student had lit paper on fire in the washroom. School did not want to pursue criminal charges. Youth diverted to rebound and referred to MCRT for resources going forward.

Petrolia- Police received a call at the High School that a student had made a threat towards another student at the "smoke pit". All parties spoken to and education provided.

St. Clair Township- Call of a 15-yr old student who had cut herself and the complaint was looking for MCRT as the youth has been struggling with her mental health. Youth involved with MCRT already and was transported to the Hospital by EMS.

St. Clair Township- Police attended a vehicle parked in the parking lot in Corunna. The youth driver had a G1 licence only. Police spoke with the youth and her grand mother who advised she had been struggling with family issues. MCRT attended and spoke with youth and education regarding the rules of the road was provided.

Lambton Shores-Caller advise of argument between him and his father. Argument turned physical when father grabbed caller by shoulders. Both separated and calmed upon police arrival. Youth to spend the night at his grandmothers. No grounds or safety concerns.

Petrolia-On going issues between father and daughter. Daughter wants no contact with her father, Family Law court order in place open ended and encouragement of father-daughter relationship. Complainant believed police could initiate a Peace Bond. Not an IPV, father daughter issues, advice given on how to begin Peace Bond process.

Petrolia-Property owners detained 2 male youths for trespassing. 3 other male youths fled the scene prior to police arrival. Police attended property earlier in relation to break and enter investigation. 2 male youths advised they were cutting through the property. Information was provided for other involved parties. All male youths located and trespassed from property. PON issued to male who invited other youths to the property.

Petrolia-Police received a call for a reported 3rd party threat. Police attended high school and spoke with all parties involved. Incident occurred over sweater that was taken. Sweater returned and all parties educated regarding behaviours and word choices. Both youths advised that they would not be communicating with each other going forward.

St. Clair Township- Police received a call that the complainant's son had returned home intoxicated and that they were arguing. Police attended, no injuries, all parties calm and agreed to go to bed for the night. No physical altercation had occurred, and advice provided. to bed. No further concerns, no injuries, no physical altercation.

CRIME & TRAFFIC – MARCH/APRIL

AREA CRIME SERGEANT

- Crime members are investigating impaired driving causing death/bodily harm involving a 6-year-old child and 8-year-old child.
- Crime members and OPP Criminal Investigation Branch continue investigating a conspiracy to commit murder and have charged two youths. The matter is before the courts.
- Crime members and OPP Criminal Investigation Branch are still investigating Andrew Chute homicide at the Marthaville Conservation area.
- Crime members are investigating missing person Deanna Timms. \$50000 reward being offered for information leading to the arrest and conviction of whoever is responsible.
- 6 Criminal Harassment investigations.
- 3 fraud investigations.
- 15 Sudden Deaths were investigated.
- Arkona Bank robbery investigation continues, arrested have been made and disclosure is being prepared
- Multijurisdictional auto theft case involving a Lambton County resident victim continues. Police have seized a substantial number of vehicles, but numerous vehicles remain uncovered. 4 arrests have been made, and a Preliminary Hearing has been requested by the accused parties.

CSCU SERGEANT

- During the months of March and April 2025 Lambton CSCU investigated 12 occurrences.
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 13 charges.
- Lambton CSCU wrote 9 warrants for drug trafficking and property crimes investigations. The unit completed 6 warrant service entries.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a property crime investigation in Lambton Shores. Persons arrested: 1; Persons charged: 1; Charges: 3. Charges include Break and Enter commit Theft and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime. Lambton CSCU assisting with search warrant at the accused's residence when other stolen property located. Items seized and returned to owners. Total seizure value \$2,500.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation in Lambton Shores/Kettle & Stony Point First Nation. Persons arrested: 3; Persons charged: 2; Charges: 3. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking & Possession of a Controlled Substance. Lambton CSCU had been conducting surveillance on an out-of-town party. Lambton CSCU formed grounds to arrest the male accused and conducted a planned stationary vehicle takedown. Lambton CSCU seized Fentanyl packaged for sale, a quantity of cash. Total value of seizure: \$6,565.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation in Chatham-Kent/Walpole Island. Lambton CSCU conducted S.11 CDSA search warrant at the accused residence. Persons arrested: 3; Persons charged: 1; Charges: 3. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking x2, Possession of Proceeds of Crimes. Lambton CSCU seized a small quantity of Methamphetamine and Hydromorphone pills, drug trafficking indicia, and a large amount of Canadian currency - \$25,927. Total seizure value - \$27,971.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Walpole Island Police Service and ROPE Squad, with the arrest of a dangerous offender on Walpole Island.
- Lambton CSCU conducted follow up on Walpole Island related to a Firearm Investigation, while conducting the warrant, controlled substances were also located. Lambton CSCU wrote a S.11 CDSA warrant at this residence. Persons arrested: 1; Persons Charged: 1; Charges: 4. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking and Possession of a Controlled Substance. As a result of the warrant, Lambton CSCU seized 98 grams of Fentanyl, and a small quantity of Cocaine and Methamphetamine, drug trafficking indicia and \$585 Canadian Cash. Total Seizure: \$8,440.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Elgin-Middlesex CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Border Enforcement Team (BEST) with search warrant in Petrolia.

TRAFFIC

- During this reporting period OPP members conducted 16 traffic enforcement initiatives
- Twenty-three (23) Part 1's, three (3) Part 3's, and Fifty-two (52) written warnings
- There were 11 motor vehicle collisions
- Ten (10) RIDE Programs were conducted
- One (1) Impaired Drivers was arrested

FRONTLINE SUPPORT UNIT (FSU):

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Using technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
