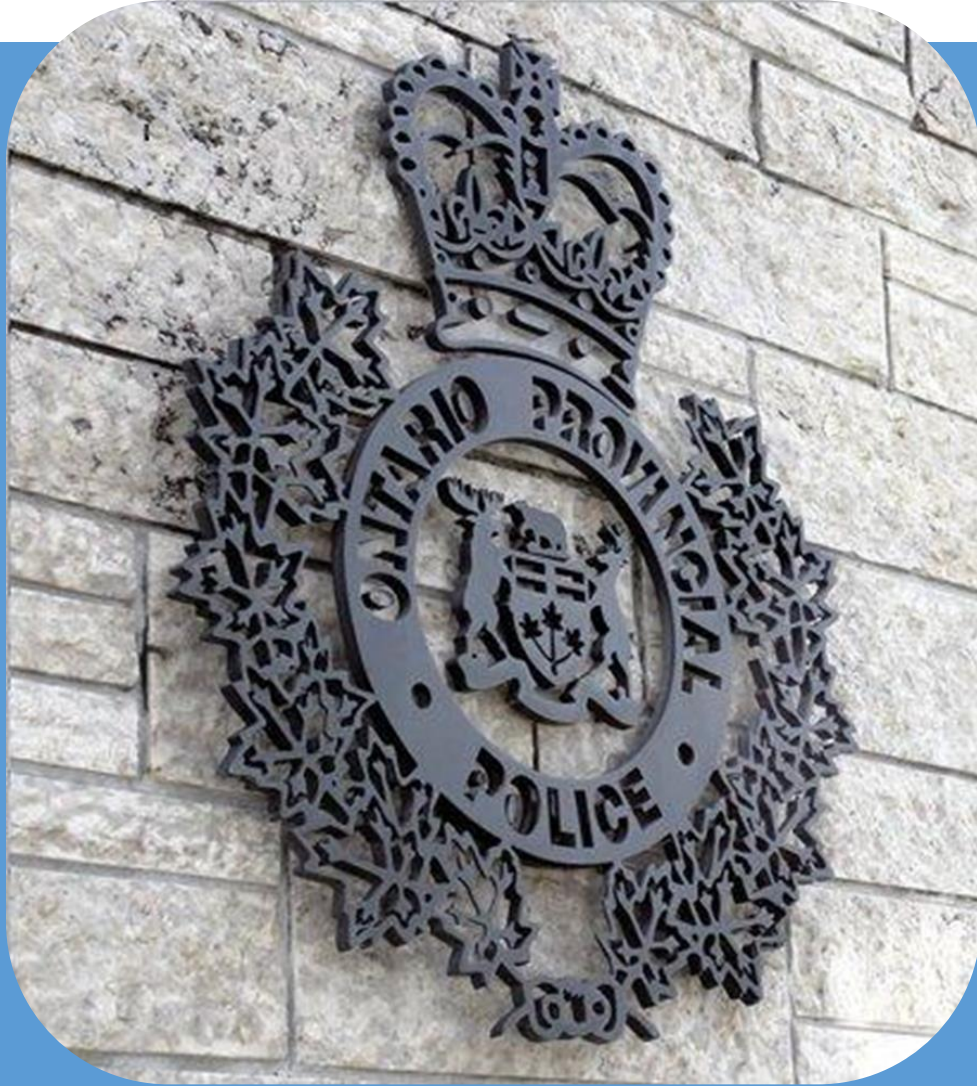

CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non- criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

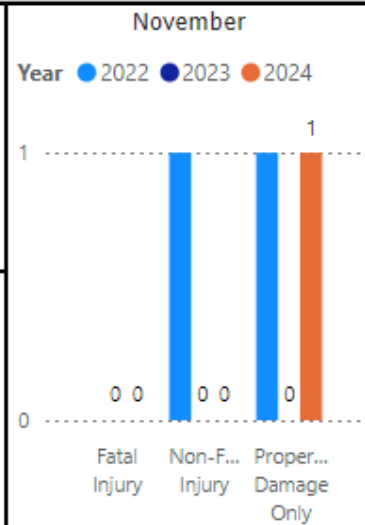

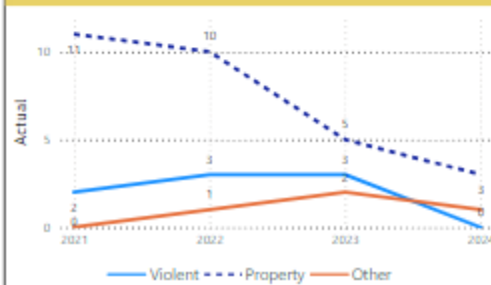

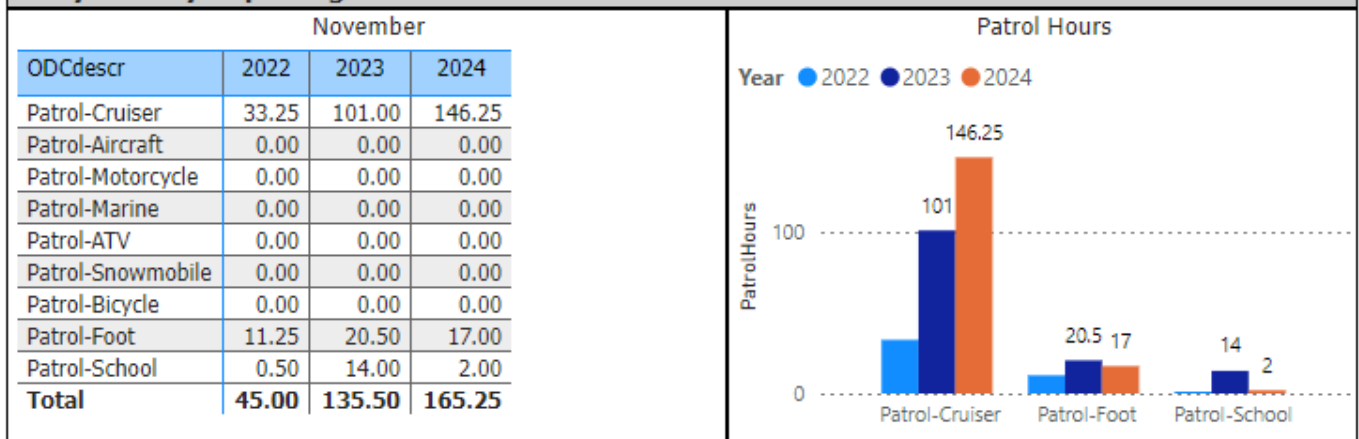

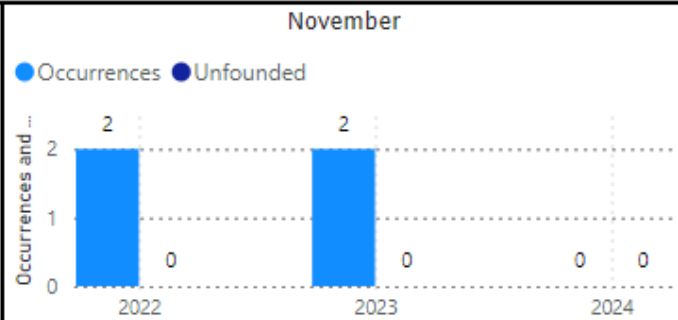

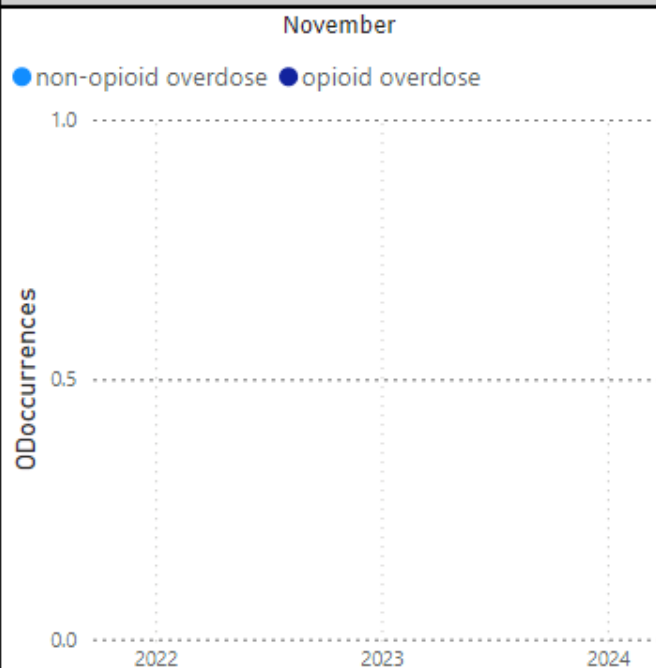

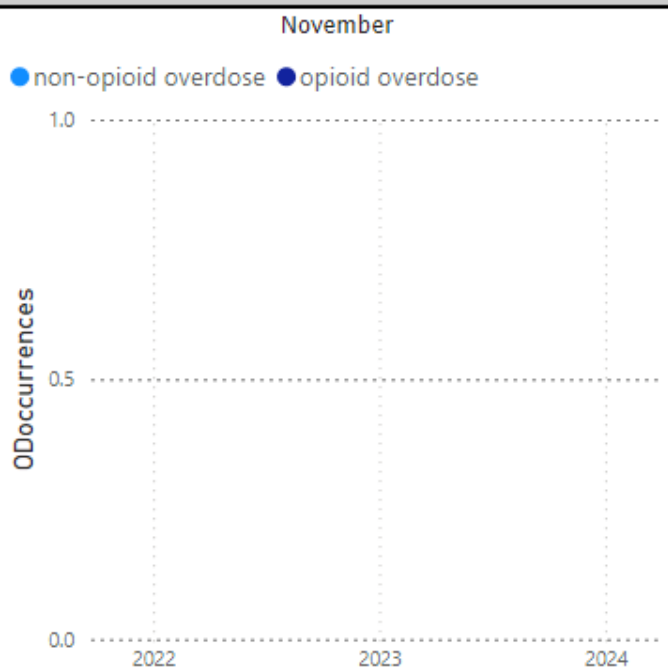

Non-Fatal Overdose Occurrences



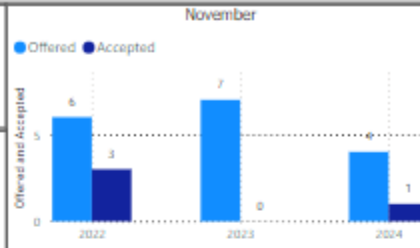

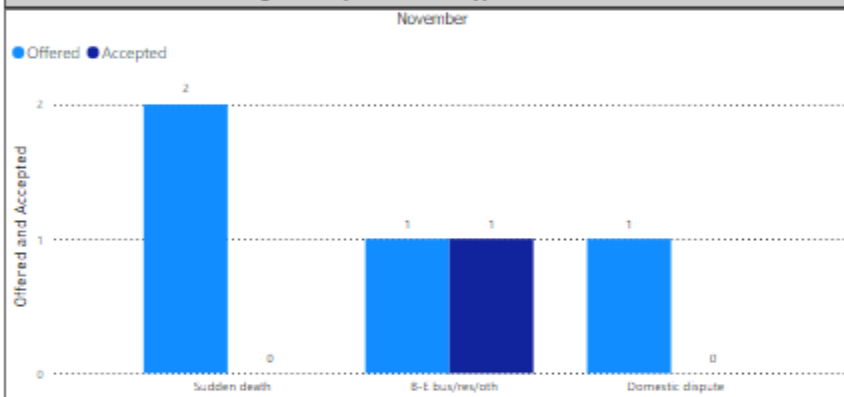

Referrals Accepted (%) by Age Group

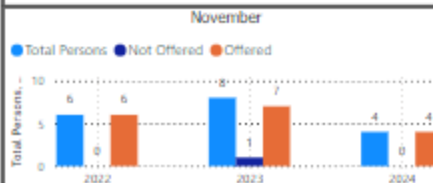

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW

November and December 2024

The School Resource Officers (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during September and October. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including youth and the law, peer to peer relationships, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Careers in policing presentations were also presented to post-secondary aged students.

The SRO assisted many of the counties primary grade schools as well during this period regarding youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions.

November

Corunna - Contacted by Principal at Sir John Moore School in Corunna regarding online threats after the fact. In house suspension handed out by Principal and educational session completed by Police.

Forest – Complainant advised that her 10-year-old neighbour came over crying, saying that her older brother was beating their dog. RPG for Causing unnecessary suffering to an animal. The 10-year-old disclosed an assault that occurred yesterday where an adult had slapped her 12 times in the head. Party charged.

Corunna - Witness is 13-year-old, posted on snapchat that a youth is going to eat her dog and she will be his next victim. Also states he told her he was coming to school on Monday with a gun. Youth does not have access to a firearm, plays video games with guns. Denies making the comments. All parents, students and Principal spoken to. Threats felt to be non credible.

Petrolia – Complainant works at the Perspective Youth in Petrolia advising youth refuses to hand over contraband pocketknife. No threats made by youth, but he is not allowed to have it. Youth spoken to.

Petrolia - Complainant received threats via Instagram from the Suspect. Suspect positively identified by audio file that she sent, threatening to attend the Complainant's residence and "slit her throat". Suspect located at her residence and arrested. Released on a Form 10 to her mother.

Corunna - Verbal family dispute over Donald J. Trump winning the USA Presidential election. Youth both uncooperative with Police and appear to have a cannabis addiction because they tried numerous times to smoke from a bong while Police were on scene. All parties involved were spoken to, safety planning discussed, CAS notified.

Corunna - Family Dispute involving a youth and his father over their son leaving the Corunna Tim Hortons with a friend contrary to his parents wishes. Youth GOA, but later attended the Corunna detachment to advise that he was fine and would be staying with his friend for the night and reassessing his living situation in the morning.

Dawn- Euphemia- Report of males exchanging threats at a bush party. All parties involved had been drinking. Further investigation revealed complainant did not attend the party but had recently broken up with a female who was attending the party. Complainant spoken to and cautioned for Public Mischief and instructed not to contact his ex-girlfriend by any means. All parties spoken to, no threats for safety.

Corunna- 12-year-old youth assaulted younger siblings. Charges declined. CAS engaged. Safety plan in place.

Petrolia - Report of male from the group home has not returned after curfew. Nearly a nightly occurrence. Youth returned shortly after 0100 hrs.

Petrolia - Fight occurred at end of day at LCCVI, Petrolia. Police and Staff attended, fight had stopped, no injuries reported, video observed and school continuing investigation. Youths to be diverted.

Plympton- Wyoming - Caller reporting his friend's ex-girlfriend is sending harassing, threatening messages. No grounds for charges. No safety concerns. Youth cautioned with her dad to cease communication, further attempts to communicate could lead to harassment charge.

Plympton- Wyoming – During traffic stop on Hwy 402. Driver on non communication conditions with passenger and passenger on non communications conditions with the driver due to co-accused assault in London. Both Y.O's arrested for breach and released on Form 9 Appearance Notice's.

Corunna - The Principal at Colonel Cameron School in Corunna reported a grade 5 youth had drawn a picture in class with some disturbing comments about a shooting. At this point not a threat. Safe school involved. Further investigation revealed that the student had some concerns with another student but would never want to harm anyone. Youth spoken to.

Plympton- Wyoming – 13 years old destroying the trailer. Known MHA issues. Police attended and spoke with youth. Upset because he could not take his medication at school. After 40 minutes of trying to calm youth down, mother arrived and brought youth to Hospital. CAS/MCRT notified.

Petrolia – Incident of an assaultive nature at youth home in Petrolia. Neither of the parties wanted to proceed with any charges. Both youths spoken to by Police and will be given disciplinary penalties from the youth home.

December 2024

Petrolia- Police received a call that a report of youth attended the Public School and one had a pocketknife with them. Police canvassed the area for youth and cameras with negative results. School contacted all parties involved.

Corunna- Principal called regards some concerns with a 10-year-old student's escalating behaviour. Under supervision at school, and not allowed outside during recess. Some rumours regarding the youth floating around in the neighbourhood. School suspension and educational talk with Police and CAS.

Dawn- Euphemia - Principal advising Police that an 11-year-old student had brought cannabis to school. Police attended and spoke with the Principal, Student and Parent. Education provided. Student suspended from school.

Point Edward – Complainant's son was on video call with another youth male. Multiple direct threats to complainant's son involving bodily harm and death with a weapon. Safety plan at school. Student expelled from school. Youth charged.

Forest – Male party followed 11-year-old female home, pulled down his pants and exposed himself. Est. 18-year-old male identified and charged.

St. Clair Twp – Complainant reporting an incident in the locker room. One player showed his penis and would not move out of the way, complainant does not want to proceed criminally but wanted male spoken to and educated. SRO's did presentation with team on bullying.

Petrolia – Ongoing issues with a male youth not obeying curfew and a report of a flip knife in his possession. Police attended the group home and spoke with the teenager, very uncooperative. Police searched the area, unable to locate knife.

Warwick - Third party call from boyfriend stating his girlfriend said she wants to kill herself. Police attend and 16-year-old female was throwing a tantrum over a dispute with her father. No real threat of suicide, no plan, declined EMS and MCRT. Females mother attended and picked her up without incident.

Corunna - Family dispute after a 15-year-old male suspended from school, he was upset that he couldn't see his girlfriend and grounded from his phone. Son punched a hole in the wall hurting his hand, EMS cleared the youth. Son was spoken to.

Corunna – 15-year-old grandson left with a 22-year-old female to party at u/k address in Sarnia. No safety concerns. Police attended, confirmed no safety concerns. Engaged with St Clair Child & Youth.

Corunna – 15-year-old female had a knife having a mental break down, locked herself in a room saying she will hang herself. Police attended and breached the door and apprehended female.

Forest – 16-year-old male stole a beer from a store, caught on video. Male ID'd and returned to pay for the beer and diverted to Rebound.

Corunna – 15-year-old acting out because she had to leave her boyfriend. Previous MHA concerns. Convinced to go home, mother ok with daughter at home. MCR referrals made.

For the month of November and December, there were **8** occurrences relating to mental health involving youths ranging from **13 - 17** years of age.

There were 8 motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of November and December involving youths **16 and 17** years of age.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **13 youths being warned** and **17 Provincial Offence Notices** given under the Highway Traffic Act. Youths ranged from **16 -17 years** of age.

- During the months of November and December 2024 Lambton CSCU investigated 15 occurrences.
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 15 charges.
- Lambton CSCU wrote 10 warrants for drug trafficking and property crimes investigations. The unit completed 7 warrant service entries.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a property crime investigation in Plympton-Wyoming. Persons arrested: 1; Persons charged: 1; Charges: 5. Charges include Possession of Property Obtained by Crime, Fail to Comply, and Firearms related offences. Lambton CSCU conducted the search of the residence and outbuildings located stolen property and a rifle. Total seizure value \$40,000.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a property crime investigation in Warwick Township. Persons arrested: 2; Persons charged: 2; Charges: 4. Charges include Possession of Property Obtained by Crime and Fail to Comply. Lambton CSCU conducted the search of a commercial property and located a stolen camping trailer. Total seizure value \$80,000.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Lambton Crime Unit with two S.487 search warrants on Walpole Island First Nation. Lambton CSCU conducted the entry and assisted with searching and processing all the evidence.
- Lambton CSCU continues to assist Walpole Island Police Service with enforcement to combat the opioid crisis in that community.
- Lambton CSCU had 4 members on a drug related training (1 week).
- Lambton CSCU assisted Grey-Bruce CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Brant-Oxford CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Elgin-Middlesex CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis.

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for the OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to the OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities.
