CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

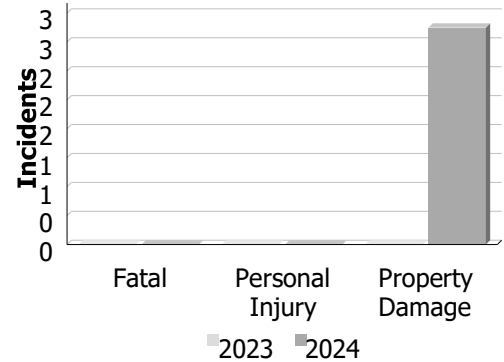
Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

Community Safety /Media Relations

Objectives of the CSO/Media Relations

- Distribute media releases in relation to the BIG4 corporately driven driving behaviours; impaired driving, aggressive driving, distracted driving and lack of seatbelt use.
- Seek community involvement by utilizing media releases with regard to property crimes such as break and enter, theft, mischief, drugs and wanted persons; with proven success.
- Prepare and distribute media releases in relation to major incidents throughout Lambton County.
- Work collaboratively with the Lambton Crime Unit, Community Street Crimes Unit, Operational Analyst and Sarnia-Lambton Crime Stoppers.
- Use social media to help promote upcoming OPP events.
- Work closely with the Auxiliary Unit to assist in any upcoming events.

NUMBER OF TARGETED MEDIA RELEASES:

A total of **37 media releases** were distributed for the month of January, four specific to Point Edward.

A total of **30 media releases** were distributed for the month of February, non specific to Point Edward.

PUBLIC EDUCATION CAMPAIGNS:

- A media release was posted about 'Lock it or Lose it,' after several thefts from vehicles had been reported.
- The CSO completed the OPP KIDS program at Ease Lambton Elementary School and continues to present at other schools in the area.
- A media release was posted about dangers of opioid use and the OPP's stance on enforcement throughout the county.
- The CSO was involved in RIDE programs on the evening of the SuperBowl, and proactive messaging was posted about arranging a sober driver for such events.
- The CSO has presented, in multiple locations across the county, the OPP 'Fight Fraud' presentations to seniors during the reporting period.
- The CSO also presented a general 'Safety' presentation in Inwood. Topics included personal safety, vehicle safety and home/residence safety. This was followed by another 'Fight Fraud' presentation for those interested.

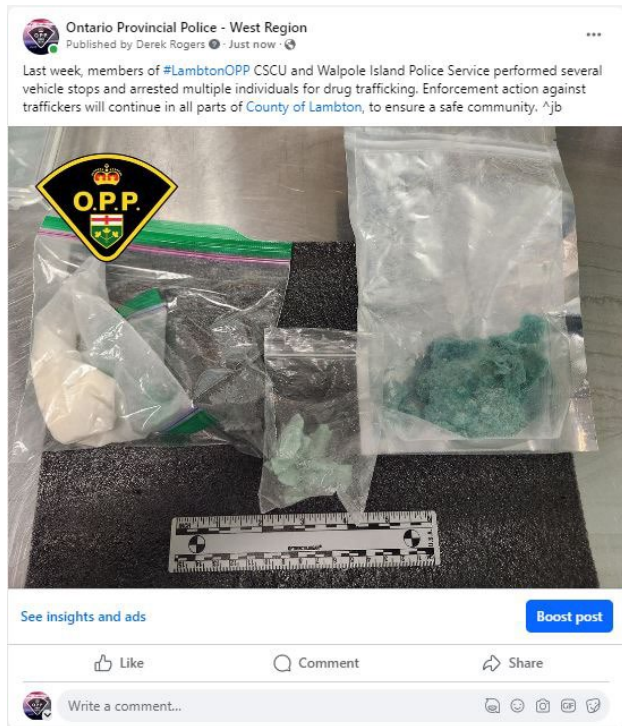

SCHOOL RESOURCE OVERVIEW

The School Resource Officer (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during September and October. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including youth and the law, drug abuse, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Bike safety presentations were also presented to elementary school aged students.

The SRO assisted many of the counties primary grade schools as well during this period regarding youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions as well as driver safety.

January 2024

Point Edward - 15-year-old male victim was assaulted by 17-year-old male on the school bus, male charged and placed on conditions not to communicate with victim, all parents notified and appropriate resources offered

Wyoming-17-year-old male driving while under the influence of alcohol. Investigation completed. The male was arrested and charged accordingly.

2 x 17-year-old males engaged into racing their vehicles on a roadway during lunch hour. Police stopped both vehicles and the drivers were subsequently charged under the Highway Traffic Act with Race Motor Vehicle. Both youths are facing a pending court date.

Brigden- A mother advising her 10-year-old daughter was assaulted at the Brigden Elementary School by a 13-year-old female. Further investigation reveals of on-going issues between friend group. The female accused was diverted by way of community programming.

Petrolia – 15-year-old male was playing in class. Second male youth, 15 years old became escalated over the situation and assaulted the male youth outside of the school. The accused uttered threats to stab the victim. No knife was banished. After further Police investigation, youth advised he had no intentions of stabbing anyone. No injuries reported and the accused male was diverted by way of attending a community program.

14-year-old male punched in the face numerous times by 13-year-old male at a local high school. No injuries reported. Deemed nonconsensual. The accused male was located by Police at the school and arrested/charged.

St Clair- Report of a family dispute turning physical with son and father after taking away dirt bike privileges. Police separated parties without incident. MCRT attended and provided appropriate resources for the family.

Grand Bend- 16- and 17-year-old females cyber bullying a 40-year-old female. After numerous attempts of asking females to stop, Police were engaged. Both females were issued a warning to cease all contact.

For the month of September, there were **5** occurrences relating to mental health involving youths **17** years of age.

There were **2** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of September involving youths **17** years of age.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **10** youths being warned under the HTA/LLCA, while **10** youths were issued Provincial Offence Notices under the Highway Traffic Act/Liquor License Control Act.

There was one 16-year-old that was reported missing and subsequently being located.

FEBRUARY 2024

Point Edward – A 17-year-old female was arrested and charged with assault.

Point Edward – A 14- and 15-year-old attended an establishment in Point Edward and were caught doing drugs in the bathroom, both youths were arrested. The 15-year-old youth was charged with possession of methamphetamine and cocaine. The 14-year-old was diverted to the Sarnia Lambton Rebound Program.

402 HWY – A 16-year-old assaulted another youth, breaking two teeth. The youth was charged with assault with a weapon.

Corunna - Officers spoke to a 16-year-old youth about posting inappropriate things on the internet.

Petrolia - A 14-year-old youth was arrested and charged for uttering threats and mischief to property.

Petrolia – Multiple youths reporting cybercrime. Youths report that an unknown user is using software to create false imagery of the victim. The suspect then threatens to send out the false nude photos of the victim unless the victim transfers money.

Forest – A 17-year-old youth was spoken to with regards to attempting to peer into the girl's bathroom.

For the month of February, there were **2** occurrences relating to mental health/suicidal ideations, all involving youths ages **13-17 years**.

There were **no** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of February, involving youths ages **16-17 years of age**.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in 16 youths being warned and 8 Provincial Offence Notices given under the Highway Traffic Act. Youths ranged from 16-18 years of age.

CRIME & TRAFFIC – JANUARY/FEBRUARY 2024

AREA CRIME SERGEANT:

- Three sudden deaths investigated.
- Lambton County Crime investigated theft of a \$50,000 Drone stolen from CBSA.

CSCU SERGEANT:

- Lambton CSCU assisted Sarnia Police Service with an Extortion case, that had ties to the Pt. Edward Casino. Physical Surveillance conducted.
- 2 – B&E's to storage lockers reported, investigated by uniform officers
- 1 – Drug Investigation conducted by uniform officers at CAS building. Youths intoxicated by drugs. One youth found to be in possession of small amount of Cocaine, diverted to Rebound Program.

TRAFFIC:

Lambton OPP officers have continued to be highly motivated and maintained a high level of proactive work in Point Edward. There has been daily work dedicated to a Focused patrol, these track efforts on areas of concerns with traffic and property crime occurrences. Businesses and Hotels in the area have increased patrols.

School patrols have been assigned every day by every platoon. This includes both foot and cruiser patrol. Efforts have been recognized by school staff and parents in the area.

RIDE programs continue during every shift to reduce impaired driving, there were 14 Rides conducted during this period.

The results have been very good. Drivers have also made comments to officers, that the number of RIDES has been noticed and appreciated in the area.

There have also been traffic enforcement occurrences in many different locations in the Village. This will also continue.

Highway 402 also has regular patrols and police presence to monitor traffic flow with due traffic backups. These are assigned daily.

A lot of great work done by officers.

You have the option to report select occurrences to the OPP from your computer or mobile device using the OPP's Citizen Self Reporting system.

Use this system to report:

3. Theft from a vehicle under \$5,000
4. Mischief/damage to a vehicle under \$5,000
5. Mischief/damage to property (other than a vehicle) under \$5,000
6. Theft under \$5,000
7. Driving Complaint

FRONTLINE SUPPORT UNIT (FSU):

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for the OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to the OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Through the use of technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
