CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

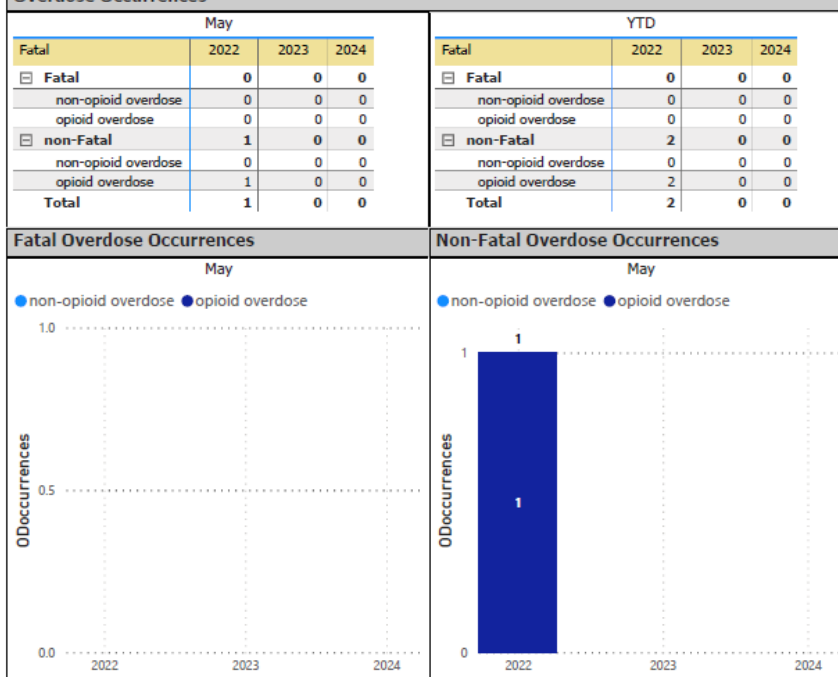

Overdose Occurrences

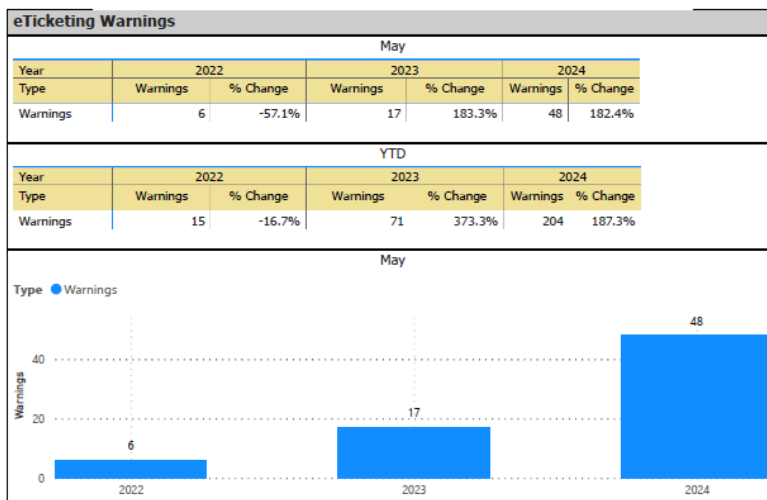

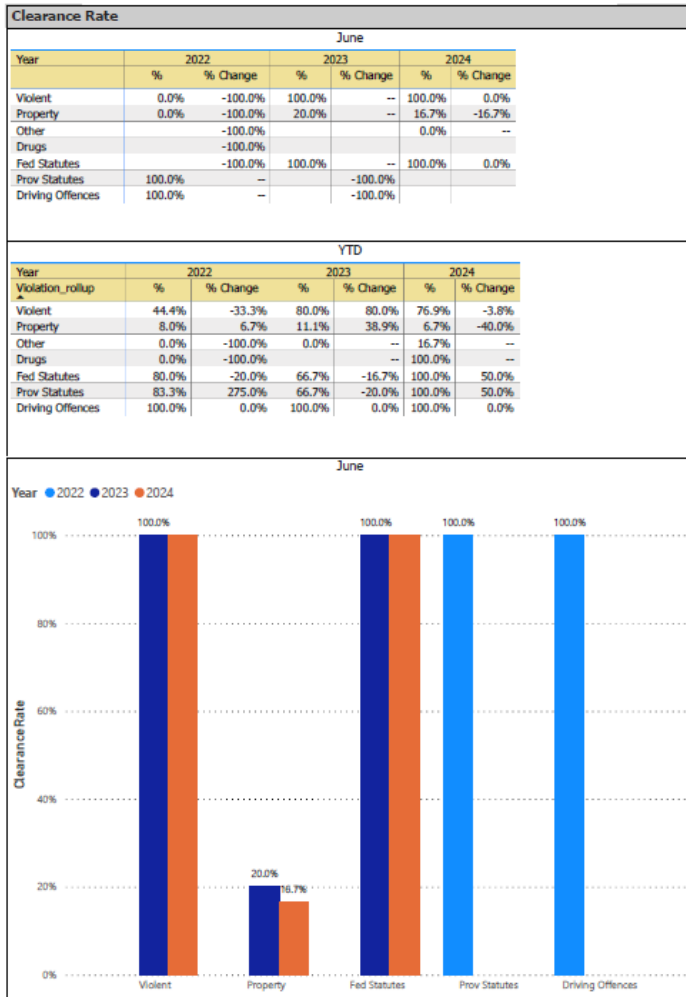


Detachment: AM - LAMBTON

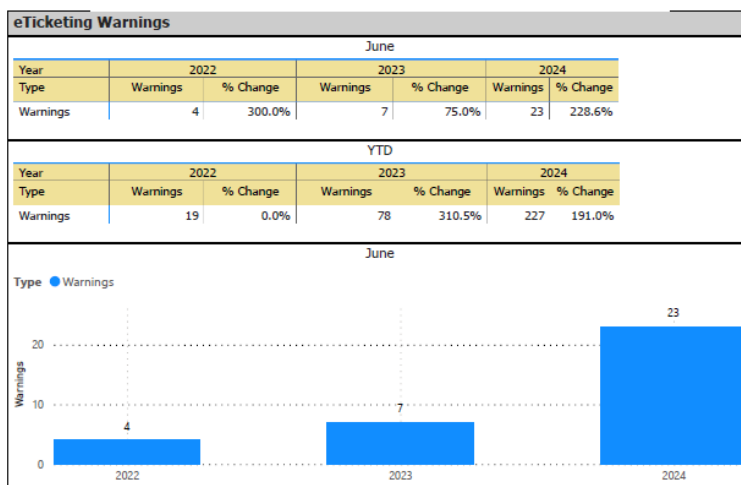


Detachment: 6M - LAMINGTON

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW – May/ June 2024

The School Resource Officers (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during May and June. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including youth and the law, peer to peer relationships, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Careers in policing presentations were also completed for post-secondary aged students.

The SRO assisted many of the counties' primary grade schools during this period regarding youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions.

May 2024

Corunna- Principal at local elementary school reporting threatening image depicting pistol shooting with "Wednesday May 29" above. Safe Schools engaged. SRO attended school on the 28th and 29th. No Suspects were identified. Incident did not occur. School deemed safe.

Corunna- Complainant's 15-year-old female daughter was trashing the house. Female admitted to breaking her phone, but the house was not damaged. MCRT activated. Charges were not requested by complainant.

Enniskillen- 13-year-old male switched to new medications causing the youth to experience a mental health episode. Police intervened and the youth attended the hospital voluntarily. No grounds for apprehension. Second incident 4 days later. No grounds for apprehension during the second incident either.

Forest- V.P. at local high school conducted a search of a 16-year-old student and their locker. A joint, vape pen, and flick knife were located on the student. Knife seized. Petrolia student diverted.

Grand Bend- Complainant (father) advises his 8-year-old daughter had been cut by a 6-year-old student on the school bus. His 8-year-old brother was also injured in the incident. Parents spoken to and CAS involved. 6-year-old student is moving out of county therefore, no safety concerns.

Petrolia- Complaint of bullying and threats involving teenagers at local high school. 14-year-old female student reported threats, through a third party, that a 15-year-old female student was going to stab her. Student then brought a knife to school. SRO involved. Youth diverted.

St. Clair Township- Complainant reported that her 15-year-old son hit his 11-year-old sister on the head and threatened to kill his father. Male youth was located at the scene and spoken to by police and MCRT. Male charged for assault and diverted to rebound.

Watford - 15-year-old youth apprehended under the Mental Health Act and transported to a local hospital. Formed by doctor.

Wyoming – 12-year-old male became enraged and choked his 10-year-old brother to the point of leaving marks and bruises on his neck. Youth in foster care. CAS and other services involved. Youth spoken to by SRO and warned.

For the month of May, there were **6** occurrences related to mental health involving youths ranging from **13 - 17** years of age.

There were **5** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of May involving youths **17 and 18** years of age.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **15** warnings being issued to youths under the Highway Traffic Act, while **19** youths were issued Provincial Offence Notices under the Highway Traffic Act.

June 2024

Corunna- Father contacted police regarding 15-year-old daughter who assaulted him and was threatening suicide. MCRT attended and female was assessed. No grounds for apprehension. EMS attended; cuts deemed superficial. R&PG for assault and youth diverted to Rebound.

Corunna- Complainant contacted police and reported that his daughter was receiving unwanted messages from her ex. Messages were non-threatening and had since stopped after father spoke with male youth.

Lambton Shores – 12-year-old male youth became violent with his mother after she accidentally erased game time on his console. Police and MCRT attended, and male youth apprehended. Youth transported to local hospital for psychiatric assessment and formed by doctor.

Petrolia - Complainant reporting her daughter (10) was assaulted while at local elementary school. Female had another 10-year-old hang off/hug her and kiss her face/head area. Incident reported to the school. SRO involved and investigation completed. CAS notified.

Principal reporting 11-year male student kicked 4-year-old student four times after the 4-year-old damaged his building. Youth spoken to by Principal and SRO and was suspended from school. CAS notified by school.

14-year-old male assaulted both mother and father. 7-year-old sister was on scene. Male charged with assault, assault with a weapon and mischief under the YCJA. CAS involved.

For the month of June, there were **7** occurrences related to mental health/suicidal ideations. All involving youths between the ages of **13-17** years.

There were **2** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of May, involving youths between **16-17** years of age.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **12** youths being warned and **40** Provincial Offence Notices given under the Highway Traffic Act. Youths ranged from **16-18** years of age.

CRIME & TRAFFIC – MAY/JUNE 2024

CSCU D/Sgt

- During the months of May and June 2024 Lambton CSCU investigated 17 occurrences.
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 47 charges.
- Lambton CSCU wrote 4 warrants for drug trafficking investigations. The unit completed 6 warrant service entries.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation and wrote a S.11 CDSA warrant to a residence. Warrant was executed and one male was arrested and charged with 9 offences. Lambton CSCU conducted the search of the residence and located a loaded .22 calibre pistol, small quantity of Fentanyl and drug trafficking indicia.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation into a wanted party, who was not abiding by house arrest conditions and trafficking controlled substances to Lambton Shores and Kettle & Stony Point FN. Lambton CSCU conducted a stop on a vehicle the wanted male was in, he was arrested and charged with 3 offences, including Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking. Driver of the vehicle was also arrested and charged with 2 offences. Excellent community impact in arresting this male who was trafficking drugs while out on house arrest.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Middlesex CSCU with two S.11 CDSA search warrants regarding drug trafficking investigations.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Essex CSCU with a warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Strathroy-Caradoc Police Service with S.487 search warrant for stolen property.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Lambton uniform officers with warrant entry and execution of a S.487 search warrant for stolen property.
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis.
- Lambton CSCU members continue to support staffing of Grand Bend during heightened summer months.

CRIME D/Sgt

- Two criminal harassments investigated.
- One Sexual Assault investigated.

TRAFFIC Sgt

- During this reporting period OPP members conducted 29 traffic enforcement initiatives
- Fourteen (14) PON's were issued and Twenty-five (25) written warnings
- There were five (5) motor vehicle collisions
- Ten (10) RIDE Programs were conducted
- Three (3) Impaired Drivers were arrested

The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Through the use of technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
