CALLS FOR SERVICE BILLING WORKGROUPS



Drugs Includes trafficking, production, and importation of drugs including marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substances. It also includes occurrences related to indoor/outdoor grow labs.

Drug Possession Includes all occurrences where the most serious violation is possession of marihuana, cocaine, heroin, crystal meth or other controlled substance. It also includes other minor drug related offences.

Operational calls for service are non-criminal events that police attend to. These include animal complaints, non-criminal domestic disturbances, missing persons, noise complaints, property – lost or found, sudden deaths, and assist public calls.

Operational 2 Includes false alarms, keep the peace and 911 calls/911 hang-ups. Due to the higher frequency of these calls, they have been separated out from the 'Operational' category and allocated a lower time standard. Traffic incidents are excluded.

Other Criminal Code Violations The majority of offences counted in the Other Criminal Code Offences group are criminal offences that are not directed to people or related to property. It is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Other Criminal Code'. These include prostitution, offensive weapons, bail violations, counterfeiting, disturb the peace, indecent acts, breach of probation, and bribery.

Property Crime Violations This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Property Crimes'. These include arson, break and enter, theft, possession of stolen goods, mischief, identity theft, and some frauds.

Statutes & Acts Includes provincial statutes, primarily the Mental Health Act, Landlord Tenant Act and Trespass to property offences. It also includes custody dispute calls.

Traffic Includes motor vehicle collisions of all severities (property damage, personal injury and fatalities) and road rage incidents reported to police.

Violent Crimes The majority of offences counted in the Violent Crimes group are crimes against persons. This category is similar to the group that Statistics Canada uses when reporting 'Violent Crimes'. These include homicides, attempted murders, assaults, threats and robberies.

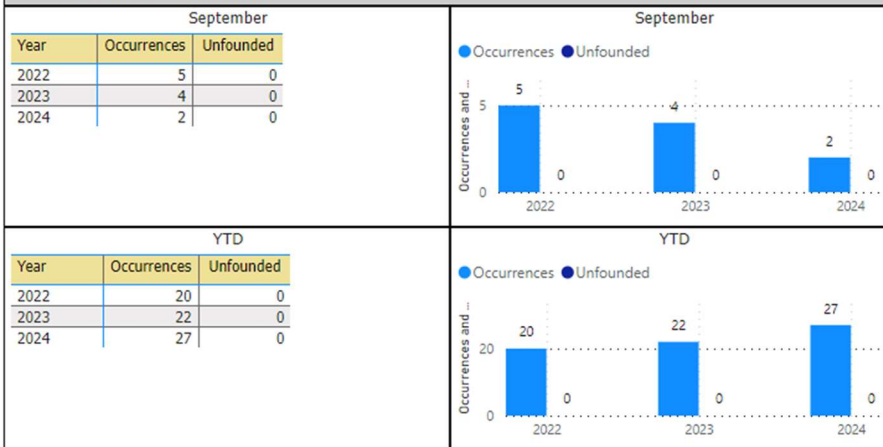

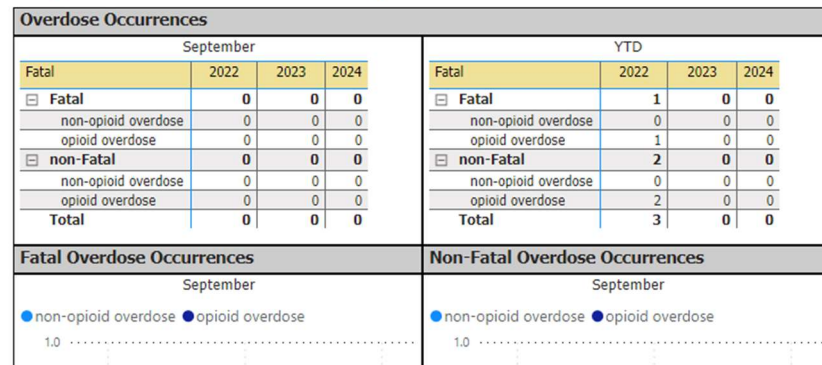


Mental Health Act Occurrences by Occurrence Type

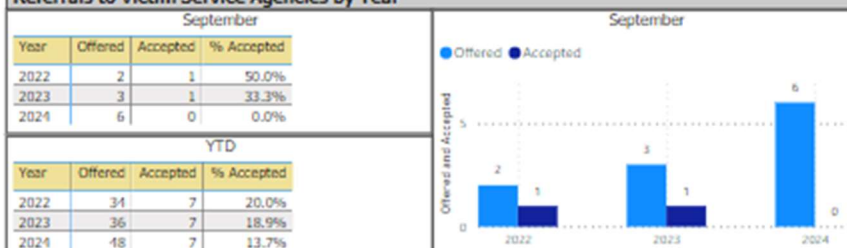
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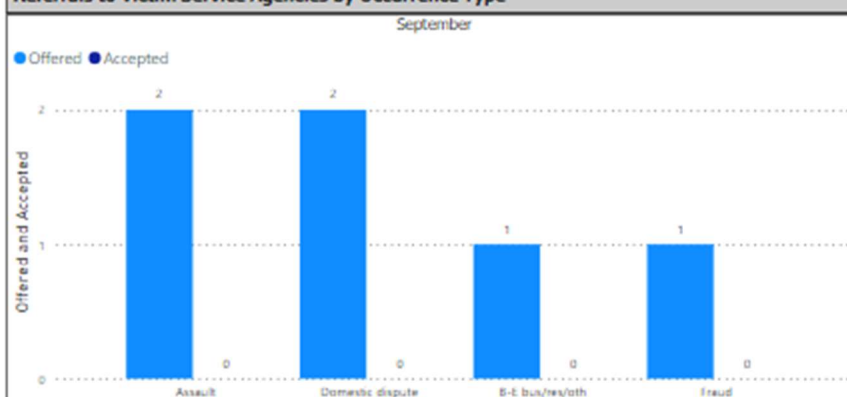

Referrals Accepted (%) by Age Group

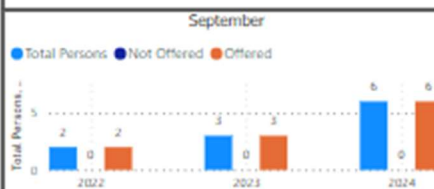

Non-Fatal Overdose Occurrences



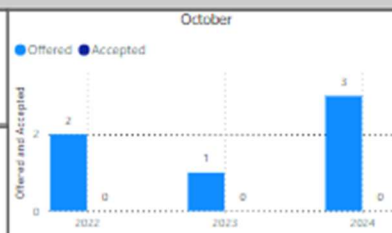

Lambton CSCU warrant seizure

On Oct 10, 2024, [#LambtonOPP](#), [#EssexCtyOPP](#), [#ElginOPP](#) & [#MiddlesexOPP](#) CSCU, alongside [#WROPP](#) TRU, ERT, K9 Unit, and Chatham-Kent Police Service Intelligence Unit, executed search warrants in St. Clair Township & Chatham-Kent.

This coordinated effort led to 2 arrests, a total of 22 charges, and the seizure of illicit drugs, cash, firearms, and other offence-related items with an estimated combined value of over \$64,000.

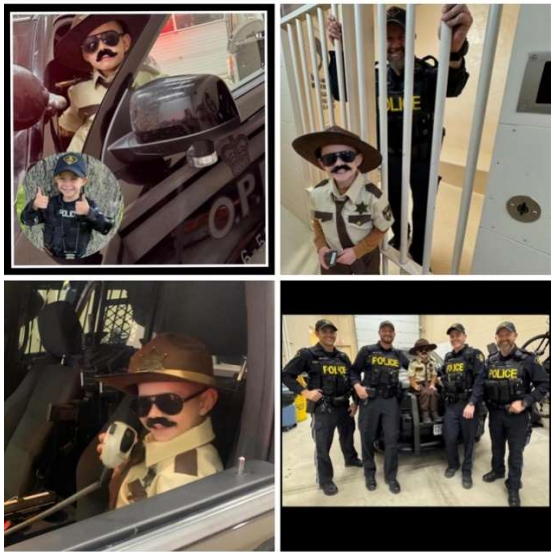
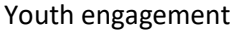

Oct 18, 2024 – [#LambtonOPP](#)'s Community Street Crimes Unit ([#CSCU](#)), in collaboration with Elgin-Middlesex CSCU, West Region OPP Tactical Response Unit ([#TRU](#)), Emergency Response Team ([#ERT](#)), K9 Unit, Forensic Identification Services ([#FIS](#)), and Walpole Island Police Service, executed a search warrant on [Walpole Island First Nation](#).

Police seized a significant quantity of suspected fentanyl and methamphetamine, multiple firearms, Canadian currency, and other offence-related items, with an estimated total value exceeding \$500,000.

Four individuals from Walpole Island First Nation were arrested and charged under the Criminal Code and the Controlled Drugs and Substances Act, with charges including possession for the purpose of trafficking, firearms-related offences, and additional offence-related charges.

All four accused remain in custody following their appearance before the Ontario Court of Justice. [#WROPP](#) ^jr

- Media release was posted regarding deer season, Halloween safety for drivers and pedestrians.
- The CSO showcased the enforcement efforts of Lambton OPP members in cases of stunt driving and impaired driving offences in September & October.

SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS OVERVIEW

The School Resource Officers (SRO) continued foot and vehicle patrols inside and outside of both county secondary schools during September and October. Emphasis was placed on driving issues during the lunch periods and end of school when most driving complaints are reported.

The SRO also continued presenting in class sessions to both secondary schools with subjects including youth and the law, peer to peer relationships, bullying, social media awareness and safety. Careers in policing presentations were also presented to post-secondary aged students.

The SRO assisted many of the counties primary grade schools as well during this period regarding youth bullying issues and social media awareness discussions.

September 2024

Plympton- Wyoming - Father yelling at daughter in the street, unknown reasons. Father had asked daughter to clean up, daughter did not want to clean, argument ensued, nothing physical

Corunna - 12-year-old female in crisis. Reported to be kicking and biting the mother, throwing paint and hitting herself in the head. Police arrived and observed youth crying but calm. Youth apprehended under MHA, formed by hospital. Female diverted to Rebound.

Forest – Fight between youths in Forest. Occurred at the high school during lunch, 4 parties involved. Victim in a place of safety. Suspensions handed out by the school. Youths diverted to Rebound.

Bosanquet- Caller is reporting an incident at the school. A 12-year-old student said they will shoot up the school. A picture of a gun shown on snapchat, no grounds for charges. School engaged resources, and Police will attend for educational part.

Corunna- Youth is trying to hurt herself. Police attended and taken to hospital for assessment, female formed by doctor under MHA.

Petrolia- Caller reporting an incident from school. 12-year-old student stabbed another 12-year-old student with a pencil. Incident started as a verbal dispute. No medical treatment required. In school suspensions and sent on a course.

Petrolia- Ongoing issues with 2 youths at Perspective Youth Services running away from home. Police located the boys on all occasions and transported home. Boys advised they get bored after 10pm. 19+ calls for to Police regards boys leaving. Boys understood.

Corunna – Youth female in a manic state and had been extremely argumentative and had become combative. Police attended, the subject was seated on the couch, and everything appeared to be resolved. Police advised complainant of the resources available to help manage the situation in the future.

Point Edward – 12 year old youth freaking out kicking people and swearing. Family friend came to school and tried to calm youth. Youth removed from school by trusted person and brought with her.

Petrolia - Death threats complain by female's ex-boyfriend. Texts from male youth with death threats towards female and her new boyfriend. Charges laid.

Lambton Shores - School alerts regarding a student communicating with a classmate. Student states he has a gun and will "Shoot up" school. Student sends photo of self-holding a non-restricted firearm. Charges laid.

October

Sombra- Historic sexual assault investigation involving to youth. Incident has occurred in both Lambton and Chatham Kent areas. Lambton O.P.P. to continue with investigation

Thedford- Dispute over Grandparent speaking to complainant's daughter warning her to stop bullying her grand daughter. All parties spoken to and advised they would not speak to each other's children.

Forest- Staff at school contacted Policing advising a student was punching staff and fellow students. Police attended, arrested and transported youth to Hospital for a mental health assessment. (Youth charged x 6) (MHA)

Petrolia- Walk into detachment reporting a verbal family dispute between the complainant's son and daughter. All parties spoken to, and a safety plan was established. MCRT engaged. (MHA)

Port Lambton- Police received a third-party call that a student, 11 years old, had made suicidal comments. Police and MCRT attended and spoke with the student and his father. It was advised the comments were made to have the principal leave him alone. No grounds for apprehension. CAS referral made.

Port Lambton- An education worker called to advise that an 11-year-old student and their sibling (12 years old) had attended her residence, smashed her pumpkins and threatened her daughter. The complainant was wanting to report the incident for information purposes only and requested no further Police action.

Petrolia- Police received a complainant regarding the sharing of an intimate image without consent between youth. Victim services offered and declined. All parties spoken to and educated on Criminal Code laws regarding youth and intimate photos. One youth was diverted to Project 1 IN 3. (1 Youth diversion)

Thedford- Caller called to report that that a 10-year-old had ran into her residence. Youth is non-verbal, possibly autistic and unable to answer any questions. Police attended, located the Youth's residence and the youth was returned back to his parents. Resource already in place.

Watford- Police were advised that a student had assaulted another student with a pencil. EMS was not required. Police attended the student was suspended and Diverted to Rebound. During the investigation Police were informed that the student felt bullied at school. Police scheduled, attended and provided a educational presentation regarding bullying and the law. (1 Youth diversion)

Point Edward- Police received a report that a student had threatened another student over social media. Both students live in Sarnia. The student who made the threat was suspended and charged. (1 Youth charged)

Bosanquet-Police received a call from a mother reporting she believed her child was being "groomed" and was sending photos to anonymous people online. Police attended, took statements from those involved and seized the device so a download could be completed. Investigation ongoing.

Bosanquet- Police received a call for a Youth who was acting out and kicking the windshield of their vehicle. Police attended and the Youth was the sole occupant of the vehicle. No grounds for apprehension under the mental health act. (MHA)

Corunna- Police called to residence for 12-year-old in a mental health crisis and was damaging photos from the residence. The 12-year-old Youth was apprehended and place on a form 1 at the hospital. (MHA)

Forest- Police were called for a report that 2 youth had brought a toy Orbeez gun to school and had shot the toy Orbeez gun at other students. All parties spoken to. Youth suspended from school and extremely remorseful of their actions. 2 Youth diversions.

Petrolia- Ongoing issues with Youth at Perspective Youth Services leaving residence and staying out past curfew. Youth returned to residence. 8 calls for service regarding Youth out past curfew.

St. Clair Township- Police received a third party call for a threat of suicide advising a Youth had taken pills and was passed out. Police attended and the Youth voluntarily attended the hospital for assessment. MCRT to follow up with family regarding resources for the Youth. (MHA)

Corunna- Police were called to a disturbance involving two youth. Police attended and spoke to the Youth who advised the altercation was over a girl at their school. Both Youth's declined any further Police involvement.

Petrolia- Ongoing issue with student at school. Student attended the office became irate with the Principal and Vice principal kicking the air and screaming. The student was suspended and escorted off the property. Follow up to be conducted regarding the Youth's escalating behaviour.

Forest- Police received a call for trouble with youth and an unknown Person creating fake social media accounts of the Youth. The Youth was not sure who would be making the accounts but had people of interest. People of interest were spoken to, and fake accounts stopped. No further action at this time.

Plympton-Wyoming- A report of on-going issues with Youth knocking on their door and running away. The complainant had caught and detained the Youth who had been doing the knocking. All parties separated and spoken to. The caller was warned. Youth and Parents declined charges.

Plympton-Wyoming- Police received a call for a well being check on a student as she received an alarming message. Police attended and spoke with the Youth and their mother. No plans of self harm and safety plan in place. No concerns for Youth.

St. Clair Township- A mother called to report that her son had hit her in the face after an argument and left the residence on foot. Police located the Youth a short distance from the residence. All parties spoken to, and the caller did not wish to proceed with charges. Youth welcome back to residence.

Watford-Warwick Township- Report of 17-year-old who had consumed 20 or more various pills and is now groggy lying on their bed. Similar event has been reported in the past. On Police arrival the Youth was being escorted to ambulance and was transported to Hospital. MCRT offered resources to family and will be following up. (MHA)

St. Clair Township- The complainant advised they had purchased an iPhone from Facebook and it was not as advertised and was purposefully modified to look like a newer iPhone. Youth who sold the phone was located and diverted to Rebound. (1 Youth diversion)

For the month of September and October, there were **15** occurrences relating to mental health involving youths ranging from **13- 17** years of age.

There were **1** motor vehicle collision occurrences during the month of September and October involving youths **16 and 17** years of age.

Numerous traffic stops were conducted, resulting in **18 youths being warned** and **8 Provincial Offence Notices** given under the Highway Traffic Act. Youths ranged from **16-17 years** of age.

CRIME & TRAFFIC – September/October 2024

AREA CRIME SERGEANT:

- One sudden death/suicide investigated.

CSCU SERGEANT:

- During the months of September and October 2024 Lambton CSCU investigated 15 occurrences.
- Lambton CSCU members laid a total of 100 charges.
- Lambton CSCU wrote 11 warrants for drug trafficking and property crimes investigations. The unit completed 7 warrant service entries.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation on Walpole Island. Persons arrested: 4; Persons charged: 4; Charges: 21. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking and Firearms related offences. Lambton CSCU conducted the search of the residence and located 13.635 Kilograms of Methamphetamine, 7.451 Kilograms of Fentanyl, 2 Rifles, ammunition, crossbow, cellphones, CDN Cash \$2380 and drug trafficking paraphernalia. Total seizure value \$507,000.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking and property crime investigation in St. Clair Twp & Chatham-Kent. Persons arrested: 3; Persons charged: 3; Charges: 63. Charges include Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking, Firearms related offences, and Possession of Property Obtained by Crime over \$5000. Lambton CSCU conducted the search of two residences and properties and located 165 grams of Methamphetamine, 6 Firearms including 2 loaded handguns, and 1 loaded rifle, 7 stolen vehicles recovered, cellphones, CDN Cash \$945 and drug trafficking paraphernalia. Total seizure value \$65,000.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a drug trafficking investigation in Lambton Shores and Kettle & Stony Point. Persons arrested: 3; Persons charged: 3; Charges: 6. Charges included Possession for the Purpose of Trafficking. Lambton CSCU conducted surveillance and a traffic stop. Lambton CSCU conducted a search of the vehicle and persons and seized 28 grams of Fentanyl and 29 grams of Methamphetamine and cellphones. Total seizure value \$7,000.
- Lambton CSCU conducted a property crime investigation into a Break & Enter that occurred in Lambton Shores. Through the investigation, the location of the stolen property was determined. Lambton CSCU executed a S.487 search warrant and recovered the stolen property valued at \$1,000. Property was returned to the owner. Persons arrested: 1; Persons Charged: 1; Charges: 1. Charge was Theft Under \$5000.
- Lambton CSCU continues to assist Walpole Island Police Service with enforcement to combat the opioid crisis in that community.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Essex CSCU & with two S.11 CDSA warrant entries and search regarding drug trafficking investigations.
- Lambton CSCU assisted Elgin-Middlesex CSCU with a S.11 CDSA warrant entry and search regarding a drug trafficking investigation.
- Lambton CSCU continues to offer support to frontline policing operations by taking samples of seized drugs and sending the samples to Health Canada for analysis.
- Lambton CSCU members continue support staffing of Grand Bend during heightened summer months. Lambton CSCU members had several charges including Impaired Operation.

4. Mischief/damage to a vehicle under \$5,000
5. Mischief/damage to property (other than a vehicle) under \$5,000
6. Theft under \$5,000
7. Driving Complaint

FRONTLINE SUPPORT UNIT (FSU):

The Frontline Support Unit (FSU) program is a differential response strategy that focuses on call management. This includes responsibility for the OPP's Citizen Self-Reporting (CSR) system which is an online police reporting system for members of the public to report specific occurrences directly to the OPP via the Internet. The FSU model will offer a call handling alternative for select calls for service allowing the deployment of resources to critical incidents or member engagement in proactive police activities. Through the use of technology, the OPP continues to improve our processes and service delivery in support of its vision.
